1. Please describe why you wish to serve on the Commission and why you think it's important*:

I come from a mixed generation Mexican-American family, with immigrant and California-indigenous roots and a tradition of public service. We built our careers in city government, public schools, and nonprofits. Still, as is often true for communities of color, the political leaders in the Inland Empire and Central Valley where we lived have only in recent decades become more reflective of the gender, ethnic and income backgrounds of the ever-growing majority of those who live there. Hoping to make our state more responsive to historically marginalized communities like mine, I have built a career and a personal life dedicated to building the capacity of underrepresented communities to amplify their civic engagement into an equally impactful political voice.

California's move toward citizen and local control means communities of interest must have strong connections to each other - geographically and politically. I see serving as a Commissioner as a natural extension of my personal values of social justice, self-determination, and collective action. As a systems-level social worker, I have worked in public policy and organizing, advocating on behalf of children and youth from vulnerable communities. I value the process and outcomes of political engagement so deeply that my volunteer efforts have been dedicated to fundraising, governance, and community engagement efforts for different groups and movements, taking on leadership roles on the governing boards of Young Nonprofit Professionals Network - Los Angeles and Pacific Oaks College. I am eager to devote myself as a Commissioner identifying communities of interest across the state and collaboratively creating fair political boundaries to translate individual voices into collective action in California.

My career a children's advocate has exposed me to the diverse experiences of children and families across the state. I have uncovered and created opportunities for youth and the adults who work with children to be heard by their elected officials. My personal and professional commitment is to ensure every child achieves to their potential, and as such, I believe all communities should be able to elect representatives who are responsive to their interests, including the best interests of their children. My work facilitating collective action, building consensus, strengthening community voice, weighing and setting policy priorities, and communicating with stakeholders and elected officials would be a tremendous asset to the Commission. Many communities and their children have historically been excluded from political power based on race, class, geography, gender, and sexuality as part of a self-reinforcing cycle of underrepresentation and marginalization across the country, entrenched through gerrymandering of voting boundaries to protect political parties and candidates. With our state's Redistricting Commission, underrepresented communities have the opportunity to move into a more inclusive democracy, reflected in community-, not politically-, drawn voting boundaries.

2. Please explain what it means to be *impartial* and describe your ability to exercise impartiality as set forth in <u>2CCR §60800</u>. Demonstrating impartiality has been central to my professional and civic work. As a coalition organizer, I have had the opportunity to pull together diverse groups of stakeholders with many perspectives on an issue, and where I typically am not an expert. Often, I lead data and information-gathering for a group to identify community needs and establish their policy advocacy goals. For example, in

establishing the Coalition for Educational Equity for Foster Youth, I facilitated the group's advocacy efforts with the belief that these stakeholders, lawyers, foster parents, educators, and foster youth, were the experts in their own experiences. My personal agenda and commitment was to ensuring positive student outcomes for foster youth, knowing this may look differently across the region, and for specific youth. As such, I was able to be a neutral convener of varied interests and consider several perspectives on how to achieve the group's goal of closing the achievement gap for Los Angeles County's foster youth. While I did have opinions and my own perspective on our advocacy goal, I lead a two-year long democratic process of coalition organizing based on consensus-building.

Likewise, as a field organizer for the California School Boards Association, I work to engage our school board members throughout my diverse division of the San Gabriel Valley and foothills of Los Angeles. Some school board members' politics and personal beliefs readily align with my own, and others are categorically different. Still, as a consensus-builder, I work to build networks across communities who share a broad commitment to public schools and good school district governance, despite political differences across the region.

Lastly, as the Board President of the Young Nonprofit Professionals Network - Los Angeles, I was committed to advancing the nonprofit professional sector as a whole, pointing the organization toward the collective professional needs of our members. As Board President, it was my role to facilitate conversations with my board colleagues that weighed competing organization priorities and opened us to all perspectives to make a joint decision based on a variety of factors.

At this point in my career, rather than pursue political or partisan positions, I instead continue in my work as a child advocate. I have donated very small amounts to a few political candidates, but I have not been deeply involved in partisan activities beyond voting. I have felt more compelled to support causes that matter most to me through philanthropy/fundraising and informally elevating their visibility within my social and professional networks. I envision the work of the Redistricting Commission as much broader in scope than my professional and personal work has been and as such, my personal beliefs beyond a commitment to fair representation would not be especially relevant. Rather, my deeply-held values of fairness, equity, and justice would ground my decisions and actions as an impartial Commissioner, and I would strive to bring about the participatory democracy goals of the US Constitution, the Voting Rights Act, and the California Constitution.

3. All commissioners must demonstrate an appreciation for California's diverse demographics and geography as set forth in <u>2 CCR</u> <u>\$60805</u>. Please describe your appreciation for California's diversity and provide any occupational, academic, volunteer, or other life experiences you have had that demonstrate this appreciation*:

My career has been marked by working across demographics, geographies, and political boundaries to ensure equity for vulnerable children and families across the state. In Los Angeles county, I worked extensively with school and county administrators in the Antelope Valley across suburban and rural communities spread through miles of desert, geographically separated by the San Gabriel mountains from the rest of the Los Angeles. Much of this work required me to bridge political, racial, economic, and even gender divides to connect folks in the Antelope Valley to each other and to the County's broad network of child advocates and resources. Likewise, as an organizer for the California School Boards Association, I regularly work with Latinx school and community leaders from working class suburbs of Los Angeles and bring them together with often wealthier, majority-white, middle-income communities of the foothills above Los Angeles. As in the Antelope Valley, my sustained engagement in these regions reveals sub-populations of shared interest, like an active Armenian-American community in Glendale, and economically vital Chinese-American businesses in the San Gabriel Valley. Working diligently to understand their shared and divergent interests, I have been able to join these groups to a statewide coalition of education advocates calling for greater investment in California's schools.

My local capacity-building work has always been situated in a statewide context. As a co-chair of the California Foster Youth Education Task Force chair, I convened foster care and education stakeholders across the state to close opportunity gaps for foster students. Dialoguing with stakeholders from government, community- and faith-based groups, advocates, students and educators surfaced an array of experiences impacting the lives young people and families across California. Though both coastal communities, children and families in the South Bay of Los Angeles do not have access to the same type of resources as children and families in Santa Cruz, much like homeless children in Sonoma after the 2017 fires needed a different set of supports than homeless children in San Diego. Over the years, I have developed a clear understanding that educating children and engaging families across the state looks very different.

A core skill in my advocacy work has been to serve as a neutral convener and conversation facilitator, weighing various data points, considering positive and negative feedback, and collaborating with colleagues to achieve consensus. In consulting with and organizing school districts throughout the state, I have built county and statewide coalitions across the shared interests of not only adults, but children in California. Deep outreach and meaningful engagement across regions has been critical to the success of my work on behalf of kids and families. Along with my personal background in San Bernardino and Los Angeles counties, I have a broad working-knowledge of the immense diversity in California that will support fair redistricting work on the Commission.

4. Please describe the relevant analytical skills (as described in <u>2 CCR §60827</u>) you possess that you believe make you a strong candidate for the Commission. My career has been informed in large part by my desire to apply my analytical skills, especially in research methods and statistics, to complex social issues to achieve more equitable conditions for people from all walks of life. I have demonstrated these skills in analyzing complex data, both quantitative and qualitative, since beginning my career as a Policy Analyst at Advancement Project, collaborating and

activating stakeholders across a variety of equity issues impacting vulnerable children, from birth through high school graduation. As a Commissioner, I am confident I would be able to solicit, interpret, weigh, and put into appropriate context a wealth of data, information, and feedback relevant to the important task of redistricting.

A key aspect of the Analyst role was leading data collection and analysis from many public and private agencies, including the state Department of Education, Department of Social Services, the County's Department of Children and Family Services, and local service providers. However, numbers only told part of the story - communicating directly with stakeholders to put the data into context helped me to uncover important policy issues. For example, after the data showed young foster children were less likely to be enrolled in publicly funded child care and development programs, my dialogue with stakeholders revealed a mix of administrative, policy, cultural, and even political barriers that prevented most young foster children from enrolling in those programs. Armed with the data and the story stakeholders helped tell, I developed several policy briefs and presentations urging public officials at the state and local level to address the issue. Recommendations from my brief were reflected in county commission reports, and I served as an expert resource to Los Angeles County's Board of Supervisors and state-level advocates in developing legislation to improve access to early care and education programs for foster youth. This effort ultimately resulted in the statewide Child Care Bridge Program for young children in foster care and for which Los Angeles County is in the early stages of implementation.

Building on my efforts for very young foster youth, in 2014, I led an organized effort of advocates in Los Angeles calling upon Los Angeles Unified's Board of Education to invest a significant amount of its newly unencumbered budget into a program to serve its nearly 10,000 students in foster care. The effort required me to request and analyze previously unreported data about the number and academic needs of foster youth, analyze new legal requirements for public education funding directed toward vulnerable students, create maps of the school district showing school sites of high need, and receive advice, input, and pushback from coalition members and critical community members about the best approach to achieving a more equitable amount of resources for these underserved students. Within a matter of months, I was able to communicate these complexities succinctly and with authority to a Board of Education who ultimately agreed to invest \$10 million in new programming for foster youth at the district.

As a child of educators and growing up in an extended family of public servants, I have always had a passion for civic engagement and public policy that advances social goods. I have pursued these interests professionally, establishing a career in child welfare and education advocacy in my roles at Advancement Project, a civil rights organization, the National Center for Youth Law, a children's advocacy organization, and the California School Boards Association, a statewide education governance association. These roles allowed me to use my skills in social science and community engagement to promote child and family well-being in California, working to secure equitable access to opportunities to succeed in life for all children. Notably, at Advancement Project, as a part of my role as an Analyst, I supported the policy and political analysis of Proposition 38, a statewide public education revenue-generating ballot initiative.

Part of my community leadership has been to serve in nonprofit governance. As Vice President and then as President of the Young Nonprofit Professionals Network - Los Angeles (YNPN-LA) I gained firsthand knowledge of working on a collaborative leadership team to advance a broad mission. Guided by a jointly-developed strategic plan to advance the nonprofit sector and professionals in Los Angeles, I led our organization to the launch of a revenue-generating professional development membership model - an effort that had struggled to be fully implemented for years prior. Recently, I was asked by a colleague in the field to join him on the board of Trustees of Pacific Oaks College because he was impressed at my ability to lead mission-based work. Supporting the governance of a higher education institution that is committed to shaping civic and education leaders in a progressive manner is very much aligned with my values of equity and justice. In addition to the volunteer hours serving on these boards, I have contributed financially to these organizations and others that have promoted the rights of vulnerable children, families, and people, including California Latinas for Reproductive Justice, the American Civil Liberties Union, the Garment Worker Center, and the El Paso Community Foundation.

I value being an informed participant in our democracy and in my community, and have contributed financially to nonprofit organizations that elevate the voices of those not always represented in media and journalism. These organizations include the Chronicle for Social Change/Fostering Media Connections, B-Word Worldwide, Bust Magazine, the Public Broadcasting System, and local National Public Radio outlets KPCC and KCRW.

Lastly, I have also contributed small amounts to presidential candidates Barack Obama, Hillary Clinton, and Julián Castro. I have not contributed to local candidate campaigns, preferring instead to promote local ballot issues relevant to progressive or children's interests through sharing information across my professional and social networks, such as hosting small private gatherings for friends or

promoting attendance at public informational events during election seasons.

The task before the future Citizen's Redistricting Commission is immense - take the latest data from the 2020 Census, and draw fair, representative, equal, equitable, and legally defendable maps for the Congressional, Legislative, and State Board of Equalization districts. The Commission will have to assess and analyze information from the Census and community input, acknowledging that many of their decisions will require weighing competing priorities and tradeoffs. The work is inherently dynamic, and Commissioners will have to provide steady leadership across many complicated discussions and decision points. I am confident I would work together with the other Commissioners and commission staff to ensure district maps are drawn with fidelity to the data, informed by meaningful community input, and compliant with the law to ensure fair boundaries are drawn and defendable.
